At Stirling Hospital Dr Thomson would be performing a range of general surgical procedures such as laparoscopic cholecystectomy and hernia repairs. He does however specialise in liver, pancreas, bile duct and gallbladder resections through minimally invasive techniques (laparoscopic / keyhole surgery).

He will consult on general surgery conditions, as well as HPB specific conditions such as liver tumours, pancreatic tumours, pancreatitis, obstructive jaundice and cholangitis, gallbladder conditions including gallstones, cholecystitis and gallbladder polyps.


